German Chancellor Angela Merkel has fuelled the debate about an EU convention to elaborate a new treaty for the EU. In a TV interview broadcasted on Germany's first public channel on Sunday, 25 August 2012, Ms Merkel made clear that Europe must take steps towards more European integration and that the question of how to change existing EU Treaties must be discussed.
