EUROPEAN CITIZENS' INITIATIVE

Level up your issue with the European Citizens' Initaitive

This year, two European Citizens' Initiatives emerged as the fastest-growing ECIs in the instrument's history, highlighting the power of citizen engagement on a variety of issues. My Voice, My Choice calls for accessible and affordable abortion care across Europe and finished 2024 by becoming the 13th ECI to reach one million signatures. Stop Destroying Videogames is tackling consumer rights in the gaming industry. Both demonstrate how the ECI can serve as a launchpad to level up your issue on the European stage! We are proud to have consulted both of these initiatives via the FCI Forum With the ECI Forum, we will continue to advise organisers at every stage of the process and provide campaigning, fundraising, and legal advice to support the growth of the ECI community.



WE THE PEOPLES



"We can't build a future for our grandchildren with a system built for our grandparents" – António Guterres, Secretary-General of the UN

This year saw the highly anticipated United Nations Summit of the Future, the culmination of a years-long process to "upgrade" the UN. Revamping our efforts around the We The Peoples campaign for a more democratic UN, Democracy International co-hosted an official side event to the Summit and a briefing with Member States. We co-chaired a official ImPACT Coalition - an alliance of like-minded organisations to contribute to the Summit. The resulting UN Pact for the Future is a milestone in the inclusion of future generations and artificial intelligence. However, but falls short when it comes to the hoped-for global governance reform. Member States scrapped every mention of the word "democracy" from the pact. With our partners, we'll keep working for a more inclusive global governance.



EUROPEAN PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS

For a European Parliament that puts democracy first

The 2024 super-election year saw even the largest democratic exercise take place: the European Parliament elections on 6-9 June 2024. The election results saw a shift to far-right parties, raising a red flag about the future of European democratic values. To counteract this potential shift, ahead of the elections, we ran the eurVote, eurFuture campaign focusing on encouraging voter

turnout, particularly among underrepresented groups and young people. We coordinted a multilingual online campaign as well as 43 get-out-the-vote activities on the ground in 10 EU countries.

Our Democratic Wave pre-election pledge campaign efforts allowed us to identify 23 Members of the European Parliament who would prioritise democracy in their term, which grew to 108 Members of European Parliament who voted to support a parliamentary intergroup on democracy.











INTERGROUP ON DEMOCRACY

A cross-party forum of Members of the European Parliament dedicated to stregthening European democracy

Following our Democratic Wave pledge campaign that identified democracy-driven Members of European Parliament, we got to work on establishing the first-ever European Parliament intergroup on democracy. The first-of-its-kind coalition would serve as a crossparty watchdog and as a launchpad for parliamentary initiatives that enhance citizens' participation in the EU, that safeguard democracy and rule of law in trying times, and that deal with the challenges and opportunities of AI and emergency tech on our democracy. Even though the intergroup was ultimately not established as one of the 28 formal European Parliament intergroups, the process served as a launchpad to setting up a friendship group of likeminded democrats.

A successful reception at the European Parliament in November was one representation of the strong and diverse backing of over 108 Members of the European Parliament from four political groups that support a democracy friendship group. In 2025, we will continue to help the champions of democracy in the European Parliament create the space needed to commit to democracy defence and democracy action.

"This super-election year taught me that there will always be winners and losers in a democracy. What matters is how we react, organise, and mobilise afterwards to protect and strengthen democratic principles. Following the US elections on the ground and working with decision-makers and partners to establish the first-ever parliamentary intergroup on democracy showed me that people are champions when we fight for our values. Sharing the space with those who work to keep democracy well and alive, even in the most trying times, is the highlight of my year." "In 2024, I had three personal highlights: During the preparatory meeting for our Democracy Camp in Bucharest, 30 young Europeans came together, developed their programme for the Camp in August and joined the international democracy community at the Global Forum. At the same time, Josi and Lorenza have joined us as full-time team members. They make sure that we can maintain and extend our work and impact for direct democracy and citizen participation. And lastly, the latest local initiative on making Cologne more bike-friendly has reached the necessary signature quorum for a referendum. Since I only moved to Cologne recently, it would be my first time voting on a citizens' initiative!"

US BRIEFING TOUR

Democracy: a work in progress

For the most closely watched election of 2024, Andreas and Daniela hit the road in a US election monitoring tour across three swing states.

We exchanged with voters, election experts, and campaign organisers, including groundbreaking initiatives. An example that directly comes to mind is the groundbreaking initiative on abortion rights. The organisers used direct democracy in a record number of states. We witnessed the extraordinary effort to protect election integrity, from visiting polling stations on Election Day to observing the work of ballot intake centers. And we observed firsthand the approaches of two presidential campaigns. While attending Harris and Trump rallies, we gained insight into their messages and stark contrasts. (And yes, we did see Jennifer Lopez on the campaign trail!)

While the presidential election results sound the alarm for democrats worldwide, we took key lessons back home with us. Democracy is about more than who holds the highest office. Ballot initiatives and local elections offer citizens a way to check and balance power. Beyond elections, democracy requires each of us to activate our inner watchdogs, scrutinise leaders, and hold governments accountable whenever they stray from constitutional and fundamental values.







GLOBAL FORUM ON MODERN DIRECT DEMOCRACY

In the face of a global decline in the quality of elections, direct and participatory democracy tools stand as vital mechanisms to reinforce citizen engagement, foster accountability, and strengthen democracy.

In 2024, a historic number of people worldwide cast their votes, while Romanians faced an especially significant voting year with elections at the local and European levels and at the end of the year fraught and eventually cancelled presidential elections. So in this super-election year, from May 15 to 18, 2024 our Global Forum on Modern Direct Democracy travelled to Bucharest, Romania. The Forum brought together over 400 participants from around 50 countries across all continents. This diverse gathering included members of civil society, academics, activists, and political representatives to discuss the all-encompaasing issue of trust. One

of the major highlights of the Forum was the launch of our firstever Global State of Direct Democracy Report.







DEMOCRACY CAMP

Democracy for young people, by young people

Five days, 10 countries, 60 young Europeans, and two guiding democracy questions – that's our annual Democracy Camp. As a youth-led project, this year, 30 motivated youth shaped their Camp during a preparatory meeting at the Global Forum in May. The Camp itself took place in Bucharest from 31 July until 4 August with a visit to Romania's current youth capital Ploiești. Together, we explored the questions "What participation tools are available to me?" and "How can I use these tools to promote sustainability and inclusive European societies?". Participants published a collection of best democracy practices they identified for Europe in the the Youth Participation Handbook.

EU FOR GLOBAL

Together to shape a better EU for the World

In a world facing global challenges, strengthening transnational democracy is crucial. Only participatory strategies and amplifying underrepresented voices can democratise transnational governance and make it equipped to handle the biggest challenges of our time.

The EU for global project builds trust in transnational democracy by encouraging the democratic participation of traditionally underrepresented groups. Starting from the European Union's pioneering role with its unique set of participatory tools, we want to know how people see the role of the EU in the rest of the world. With citizen panels in eight countries, we want to co-design recommendations on EU policies towards global issues in 2025.

Life as an Activist brings together South American activists and youth in Germany to explore the power of democratic participation. Through mini-documentaries featuring the activists and their work, workshop participants learn how tools like citizens' assemblies, referendums, and participatory methods have empowered communities to protect the environment and defend indigenous rights. SCHOOL TOURNAMENT

Our school competition for the European elections: Fresh, new and especially young ideas to increase voter turnout.

In our school competition for the 2024 European Elections, we empowered young people to shape democracy. Across six schools in North Rhine-Westphalia, pupils aged 16-18 learned about the EU elections through workshops and trainings and then unleashed their creativity in a playful competition. Their mission was to inspire classmates, schools, and communities to vote. Activities were evaluated by a jury based on outreach, creativity, and impact on first-time voters. Supported by Democracy International, Mehr Demokratie, and NRW Science Campus, the project combined education, innovation, and action to strengthen voter engagement. It was funded by the European Parliament and Post Code Lottery.

DIRECT DEMOCRACY NAVIGATOR

Democratic empowerment through science

The Direct Democracy Navigator, our database of direct democracy tools around the world, adds an academic direction of Democracy International's work. We published the first-ever "Global State of Direct Democracy Report", which monitors and evaluates direct democracy developments around the world, global trends and predictions for the future. The team conducted three "Direct Democracy 101" workshops and four webinars focusing on the basics and intricacies of direct democracy, from why legislations matter to what are the specifics of rejective referendums, from Taiwan to Uruguay to EU countries.


